A Brief History of the University of Waikato Te Whare Wānanga o Waikato

The University of Waikato/Te Whare Wānanga o Waikato celebrated its 40th anniversary in 2004. We embraced the opportunity presented by this significant milestone to reflect on our many achievements and successes since 1964, while at the same time looking ahead with great optimism to the future.

The University had its genesis in 1956, when a small group of visionary individuals began working towards the founding of a university for the people of the South Auckland region. A college, a sub-branch of Auckland University, was established in 1959 and in 1965, after opening its doors in 1964, the University of Waikato was officially opened by the then Governor-General, Sir Bernard Fergusson (later Lord Ballantrae).

From these modest beginnings, on what was largely farmland and with only a handful of temporary buildings and staff, the University of Waikato now employs approximately 1600 staff. We offer more than 200 qualifications and have approximately 13500 students, of whom more than 5500 complete a qualification annually. Our main campus in Hamilton covers some 65 hectares and provides comprehensive teaching, research and cultural facilities, student accommodation, banks and cafes, excellent sports and recreation amenities and extensive gardens.

The Hamilton campus is located close to a recently established Innovation Park, making us exceptionally well placed to contribute to the local and national economies by enhancing business capability in the region and increasing opportunities for the commercialisation of intellectual property.

The University of Waikato at Tauranga provides students in the Tauranga/Bay of Plenty area with the opportunity to complete qualifications locally, with many of the programmes being provided in co-operation with the Bay of Plenty Polytechnic. We also continue to deliver programmes in various locations throughout our region and more than 20 of our qualifications are available entirely or mostly through online study.

Co-operation and collaboration are fundamental principles to the way the University of Waikato operates. We are a member of the Tertiary Education Alliance, alongside the Bay of Plenty Polytechnic, Tairāwhiti Polytechnic, Waiariki Institute of Technology, Western Institute of Technology and Wintec. This alliance is a highly successful example of a co-operative approach to education planning and provision. It provides clear academic pathways through agreed articulation, credit and contractual teaching arrangements, and as a result, students in the region can take advantage of a variety of tertiary opportunities that would not otherwise be so accessible.

We define our region in terms of the tribal boundaries of the 16 iwi affiliated to Te Rōpu Manukura. It extends from Manukau down to Wanganui, across to Kahungunu, along the East Coast up to Hikorangi, continuing up to the Bay of Plenty, to the Coromandel and back to Manukau. We sit at the heart of a community of strong regional partnerships and take pride in the extent to which we reflect and serve the strengths and interests of our region.

From its inception the University has always been at the forefront of initiatives in support of Māori aspirations, working closely with local iwi, particularly Tainui, to make the University accessible to Māori students and to foster an environment of success. Today we are proud to have the highest proportion of Māori students of any New Zealand university.

We continue to foster a culture of internationalisation, measured through the diversity of our student and staff profiles, the support and celebration of that diversity, a long-standing pride in our reputation for the pastoral care of our international students, and the measures we take through curriculum, programme design and our global networks and connections to international influences.

We are proud of our evolution into a truly New Zealand institution which, as our motto reflects, supports our country's nation-building policies and reflects our nation's identity.

Chancellor

Mr John Gallagher CNZM, O.St.J, JP



As a business leader John Gallagher brings a wealth of business and community experience to the University Council. He is a shareholder and director of one of New Zealand's most successful export companies, the Gallagher Group. As an ardent supporter of growth and development in the community, John is actively involved with numerous community organisations including Habitat for Humanity, Rotary, St John's Ambulance and WEL Energy Trust. He served as the Deputy Mayor of Hamilton City from 1997 to 1998 and twelve years as a City Councillor. As a local body politician he has been instrumental in promoting and driving many of the city facilities and services. John was first elected to the University Council in 1990 as the representative of the Employers' Association. John is also a member of the Finance Committee and Deputy Chairman of the University of Waikato Foundation.

Pro Chancellor

Mr John Jackman B.Ag.Sci Lincoln



John Jackman was raised on a sheep and cropping farm at Cheviot, North Canterbury. He graduated in Agricultural Science from Lincoln College and joined the then Department of Agriculture in Hamilton in 1968.

Initially a financial adviser to the farming sector, he became involved in major change situations – initially in farming but this soon extended into new technologies and agricultural policy. He played significant roles both in implementing and dismantling the Government interventions in agriculture of the 70's and 80's. During this time he also took a 4-year overseas posting as Counsellor (Agriculture) at the NZ High Commission, London.

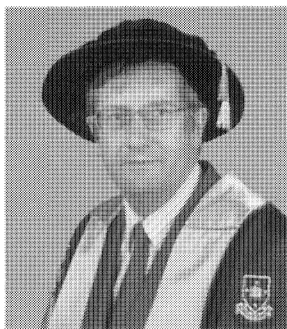
He returned from overseas to a position in the Directorate General of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries where he was at the interface between the Ministry and the Minister. In 1987 the MAF undertook a major restructuring and with it John changed his career path. He moved from Head Office to a frontline regional role and was then promoted to Director of North Region of MAFTech based at Ruakura with responsibility for 40 percent of MAF's research and consultancy. This was a period of intense entrepreneurial activity as science and advisory services sought to become commercially viable. The next step was the formation of the Crown Research Institutes. John convened the establishment unit for AgResearch – the largest CRI. He was appointed foundation Deputy CEO of AgResearch.

John resigned from AgResearch in 1995 to form a consultancy practice under the name of Foresight Consultancy. He undertook overseas assignments for the World Bank, however his primary interest lay with the Waikato Innovation Park and related projects.

In 2000 he was appointed to the Council of the University of Waikato as a Government nominee. He currently chairs the Finance Committee of the University.

Vice-Chancellor

Professor R Crawford BSc(Hons) PhD DSc *Belfast* FIMechE FIMMM FREng



Professor Crawford was born in Lisburn, Northern Ireland and has spent most of his academic and professional life in Northern Ireland. He is a Professor of Mechanical Engineering, whose primary research interest has been in the mechanical properties and processing behaviour of plastics. From 1999 - 2001 he was Professor of Mechanical Engineering at the University of Auckland, and has on-going research and business interests in New Zealand associated with the establishment of a new polymer research centre there. His previous position was the Senior Pro Vice-Chancellor at Queen's University, Belfast, with special responsibility for Research and Development.

For the last 3 years, Professor Crawford has been a senior member of a small team that manages all aspects of Queen's University. He has published 7 books and over 270 papers and has been a member of numerous government panels and research grant committees in the UK. He is a member of a number of professional organisations and a Fellow of the Royal Academy of Engineering. He is directly involved in a wide range of professional activities and organisations, including consultancies and company directorships. He has had substantial and very successful experience in the Research Assessment Exercise in the UK, having led his own school, the School of Mechanical and Process Engineering. He has had wide experience both in the UK and in New Zealand raising international funds for research purposes. Married with two sons and one daughter, Professor Crawford is a UK national and is also a permanent resident of New Zealand.

Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic)

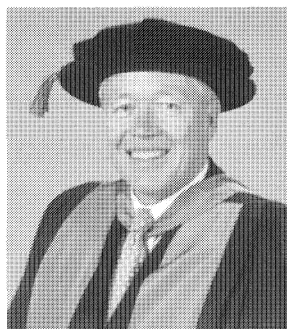
Professor Peggy G Koopman-Boyden CNZM MA DipEd *Massey*



The Dean of the School of Social Sciences since 1995 Professor Koopman-Boyden was appointed the Dean of Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences from 1999. Previously she was the CEO for the New Zealand Institute of Social Research and Development, and lectured at the University of Canterbury. She was also the co-founder and Director of the Southern Cross Language Institute in Christchurch. Professor Koopman-Boyden has undertaken sociological, demographic and policy research on ageing, and has chaired or has been a member of many national committees on social policy, family, women, the elderly and complementary and alternative health. These include the New Zealand Planning Council, National Council on HIV/AIDS, and the Gerontology Association. She is a Life Member of Age Concern (Canterbury) and was awarded a CNZM (Companion of the NZ Order of Merit) for services to the elderly.

Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Research)

Professor Richard Bedford BA MA *Auckland* PhD *Australian National University, Canberra*



Professor Bedford is currently Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Research) at the University of Waikato where he has been Professor of Geography since 1989. In 2000 and 2001 he was Director of the University's satellite campus in Tauranga. He has undergraduate and graduate degrees from the University of Auckland and his PhD was completed in 1971 in the Research School of Pacific Studies at the Australian National University. He is a specialist in migration studies and since the mid-1960s has been researching processes of population movement in the Asia-Pacific region. During the 1980s Professor Bedford was the Convenor of the Population Monitoring Group of the former New Zealand Planning Council. He was awarded the NZ 1990 Medal for Services to New Zealand. In 2000 he was elected to the Fellowship of the Royal Society of New Zealand. He is a member of the New Zealand National Commission for UNESCO and Chair of the Commission's Social Sciences Sub-Commission. He is also the New Zealand Immigration Service's representative on an inter-governmental International Metropolis Project, and the Royal Society of New Zealand's contact point with the International Human Dimensions of Global Environmental Change Programme. In 2001 he was appointed by the Minister of Immigration as academic adviser to the Ministerial Advisory Group on Immigration.

Pro Vice-Chancellor (Māori)

Professor Tamati Reedy BA MA Auckland MA PhD Hawai'i



Professor Reedy is the Pro Vice-Chancellor with responsibilities for Māori development in the University. Professor Reedy was the foundation Dean and Professor of the School of Māori and Pacific Development at the University of Waikato, created in 1996. Professor Reedy gained his MA in English at Auckland University, and an MA and Doctorate in Linguistics at the University of Hawai'i. He was also a Fulbright Scholar at the University of Alabama. Prior to his appointment as Dean in 1996, Professor Reedy was the Chief Executive and Secretary for the Māori Affairs Department, New Zealand. He was awarded the 1990 New Zealand Medal. With his wife Tilly, he has managed his own consultancy business in education and training in the public and private sector until his appointment at Waikato University. He is Ngāti Porou.

Associate Professor Alan Neilson BSocSc MSocSc Waikato MSc York (UK)

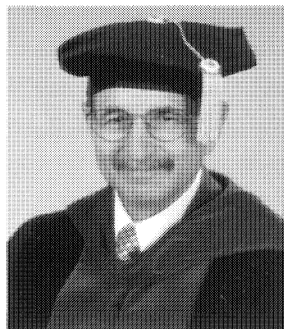


Associate Professor Neilson was educated at Tauranga Boys' College, the University of Waikato and the University of York (England).

Dean of Arts and Social Sciences

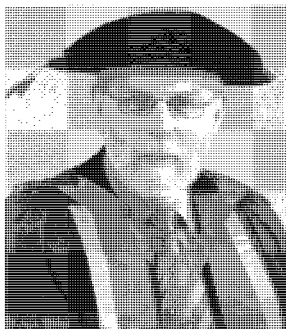
Professor Daniel Zirker BA MA Montana PhD Alberta



Professor Zirker previously served as the Dean of Arts and Sciences at Montana State University-Billings from 1998-2004, Professor of Political Science and various administrative positions at the University of Idaho from 1985-1998, and Assistant Professor of Political Science at Minnesota State University, Mankato from 1983-1985. Since 1999 he has held the position of the chair/president of the Research Committee on Armed Forces and Society of the International Political Science Association. A former U.S. Peace Corps volunteer in Northeast Brazil from 1970-1972, he was a Fulbright senior lecturer at the University of Dar es Salaam, Tanzania in East Africa during the 1989-1990 academic year. He has published in academic journals on democratisation, economic development and civil-military relations in Brazil as well as in Africa and Eastern Europe. He co-edited two books with Constantine Danopoulos, applying the lessons of the recent history of Latin America and Southern Europe to civil-military relations in Eastern Europe, the most recent of which is *The Military and Society in the Former Eastern Bloc* (Westview 1999).

Dean of Computing and Mathematical Sciences

Professor Mark Apperley BE PhD Auckland FNZCS



Professor Apperley began his academic career in electrical engineering but after completing his PhD at Auckland University, and a period of post-doctoral research at Imperial College in London, he returned to New Zealand in 1975 to take up a lectureship in Computer Science at the University of Waikato. In 1985 he became Professor and Head of the Computer Science Department at Massey University. He returned to Waikato University in 1994 as Chair of the Department. Throughout his 30-year academic career he has been very active in research in the area of human-computer interaction. He was appointed to the position of Dean of Computing and Mathematical Sciences in early 2003.

Principal and Dean of Education

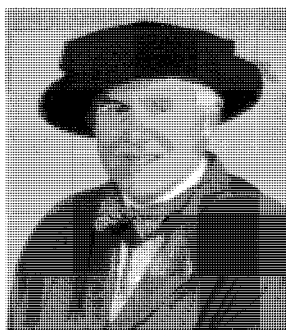
Professor Noeline Alcorn BA Victoria MA Canterbury PhD California DipEd Massey DipT FNZEAS



Professor Alcorn taught in New Zealand secondary schools for some years before undertaking her doctoral study at the University of California. She held lecturing and management positions at Auckland Teachers' College and was the Director of the Centre for Continuing Education at the University of Auckland before taking up her current position as Principal and Dean at the School of Education. Professor Alcorn was Chairperson of the New Zealand Council for Educational Research from 1988 until 1993, and was awarded the Suffrage Medal in 1993. She is a Fellow of the New Zealand Educational Administration Society. Professor Alcorn has published widely in children's literature, school principalship and action research, and is currently researching educational administration, professional development and higher education policy. In 1999 she completed a biography of C.E. Beeby. She is the inaugural chair of the Teacher Education Forum of Aotearoa New Zealand.

Dean of Law

Professor John Farrar LLB (Hons) LLM LLD London PhD Bristol



Professor Farrar joined the University of Waikato in 2004 as Dean of the School of Law. He was formerly Dean of Law at the University of Canterbury and Dean of Law and Acting Vice-Chancellor at Bond University, Queensland. He is an Emeritus Professor of Law, Bond University, and a Professorial Fellow, University of Melbourne.

Professor Farrar is a member of the Legislation Advisory Committee and has been a consultant to the Business Council of Australia, Australian Institute of Company Directors, IFSA and New Zealand Treasury. He set up Community Legal Advice Centres in Bristol, Christchurch and the Gold Coast. He has experience in Company Law, Corporate Governance and Insolvency.

Dean of Management

Professor Michael Pratt BA (Hons) *Sheffield MCom Witwatersrand DCom South Africa ACA FCA*



A specialist in the areas of performance, organization theory and auditing Professor Pratt joined the University of Waikato in 1990 as Dean of the Waikato Management School. He was previously Professor and Head of Department of Accounting at Massey University. With extensive industry experience Professor Pratt is currently involved in researching peak performing organisations. He has published eight books and more than one hundred journal and conference papers. He advises the CEOs and top management teams of several leading global corporations in the USA and Europe on inspiration, peak performance, and value creation.

Dean of Māori and Pacific Development

Professor G. R. Aroha Yates-Smith BA MA PhD *Waikato DipT Hamilton Teachers' College*



He uri tēnei nō ngā iwi i heke mai ai i runga i ngā waka o Te Arawa, o Tainui, o Takitimu, o Horouta, me ngā iwi hoki i take mai nei i te whenua nei, i te Ūkaipō.

Professor Yates-Smith is the Dean of Te Pua Wānanga ki te Ao, the School of Māori and Pacific Development. She completed her BA, MA, and PhD at the University of Waikato, and her Diploma of Teaching at the Hamilton Teachers' College. Aroha entered this University as a Junior Lecturer in 1986, after having taught Māori and German at Hillcrest High School. She held a Fulbright Scholarship at the University of Hawai'i, at Manoa in 1992 and in 1999 became the first PhD graduate from Te Pua Wānanga ki te Ao. She was the recipient of Te Rangi Hiroa (Sir Peter Buck) medal in 2003 for her analysis of the role of women in pre-contact Māori society. Professor Yates-Smith's research interests lie in the study of the feminine in Māori society and Māori spirituality.

Dean of Science and Engineering

Professor Richard Price BSc (Hons) *Australian National University PhD Otago*



Professor Price joined the University of Waikato in 1998 as the new Dean of the School of Science and Engineering. Formerly an Associate Professor in Geology at La Trobe University, Professor Price gained his bachelors degree in geology from Australian National University, and was awarded his doctorate from Otago University in 1974. His major research interests include the application of trace element, major element and isotope geochemistry to geological problems throughout Australia, New Zealand and the Pacific. With a distinguished academic and publishing record to his credit, Professor Price is currently involved in a co-operative research project with academic colleagues from Auckland, Victoria and Massey Universities, studying the geology of Mounts Ruapehu and Taranaki.

The University Crest

The motto, Ko Te Tangata, means 'For the People' and reflects the University's philosophy that people are central to the institution and its most valued resource. The outside red border is a stylised fern frond or pitau that symbolises new birth, growth, vitality, strength and achievement. Inside the border is the University's coat of arms. The open book surrounded by the four stars of the Southern Cross is a symbol of learning. The crest design is in the University's colours of black, red and gold.

Ceremonial Traditions

Elements of university graduation ceremonies have evolved from the 12th century when the first universities emerged in Europe. The organisation of medieval universities was modelled on the established institutions of the day – the church, the monastery, and the guild.

Latin was the language used by medieval scholars, and it is from Latin that the words 'university' and 'degree' are derived. The Latin term *universitas* means a guild or union and universities started as a scholastic guild – a self-constituted community of teachers and scholars.

The word graduate comes from the Latin word *gradus*, which means step. Admission to study a bachelors degree was the first step taken towards completing a university education. The second step was to become a 'master'. Masters were Master of Arts graduates whose degrees licensed them to teach. The Chancellor, an officer of the cathedral, originally granted teaching licences.

Ceremonial Robes



In the Middle Ages the corporate existence of universities was recognised and sanctioned by civil or ecclesiastical authority. The regalia worn by graduates and university staff today reflect this mix of medieval governance. Robes worn by the Chancellor resemble those worn by the Lord Chancellor of England. Graduates and academic staff wear gowns similar to the dress of medieval clergy. Hoods are also fashioned on an everyday medieval garment, although the coloured lining was a later addition to indicate the wearer's university and degree.

The academic gowns and hoods worn by graduates and University staff today are fashioned on everyday medieval garments.

University of Waikato Academic Dress

Academic regalia are as follows:

First Bachelors: Black gown; black hood with gold lining; black mortarboard.

Bachelors with Honours: Black gown; black hood with gold lining and gold border 5cm in width; black mortarboard.

Masters: Black gown; gold hood with gold lining; black mortarboard.

MPhil: Black gown; crimson hood with crimson lining; black mortarboard.

PhD: Maroon gown; crimson hood with crimson lining; black Tudor bonnet.

DLit, DSc: Crimson gown; crimson hood with crimson lining; black Tudor bonnet with gold cord and tassel.

HonD: Crimson gown; gold hood with gold lining; black Tudor bonnet with gold cord and tassel.

Chancellor and Vice-Chancellor: Black gown with lining of gold satin; gold button and cord just above the sleeves which are also lined with gold satin; a replica of the University's coat of arms just above the gold button on the shoulder; black Tudor bonnet with gold cord and tassel.

Pro Chancellor: Black gown with lining of gold satin; gold button and cord just above the sleeves which are lined with black satin; black Tudor bonnet with gold cord and tassel.

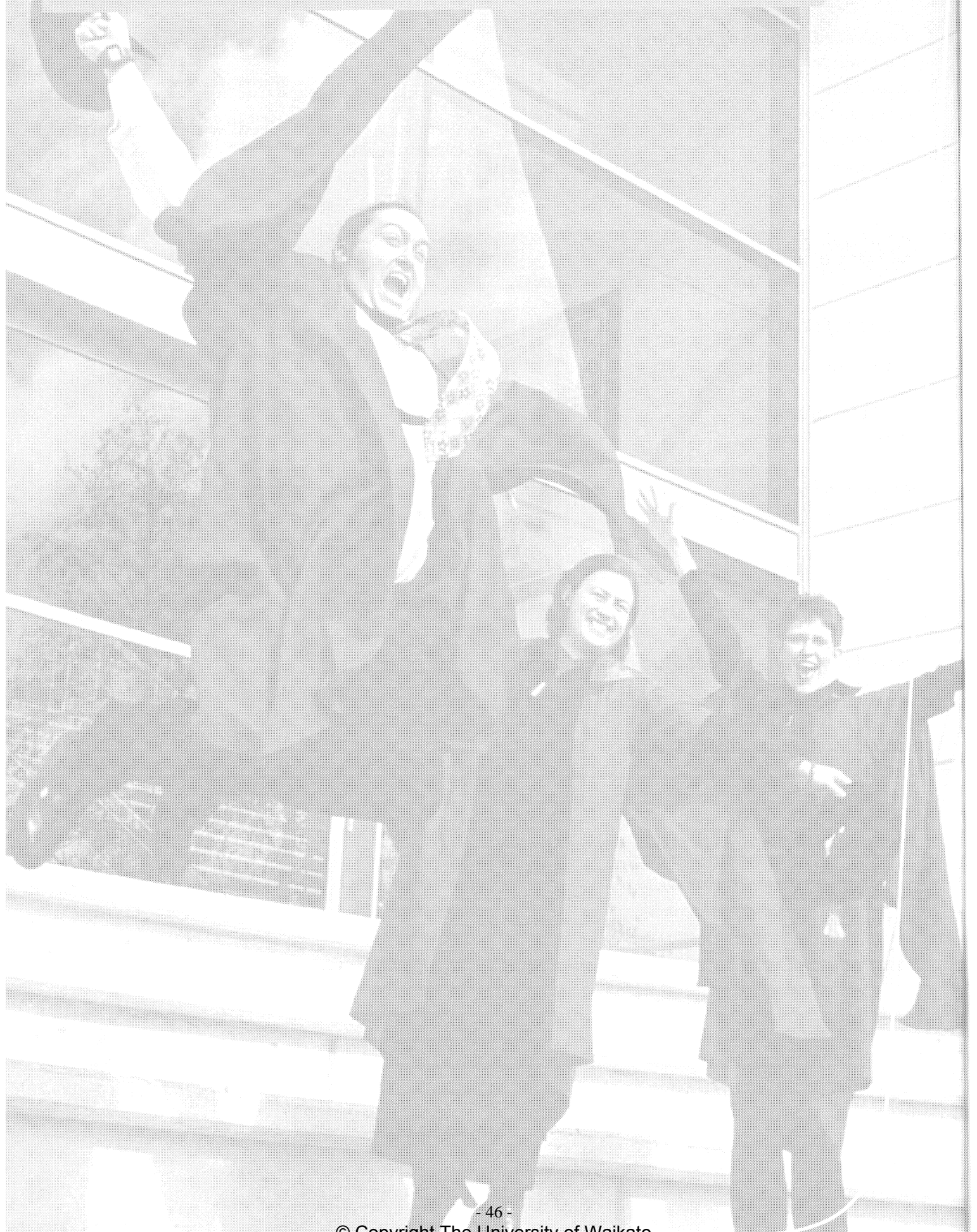

Degree of Honorary Doctor of the University of Waikato

Hare Wakakaraka Puke

Hare Wakakaraka Puke of Tainui was awarded the degree of Honorary Doctor of the University of Waikato on 15 December 2004. The award recognises the outstanding dedication that he has demonstrated towards his community of Tainui-Waikato and to the ideals of a bicultural society, and his tireless support for the development of research and tertiary education opportunities for Māori. Since its inception in 1993, Hare Puke has served on Te Rōpū Manukura, the iwi forum, which acts as guardian of the Treaty of Waitangi for the University of Waikato. He has been the University's kaumātua since 2000. (He is also kaumātua for the Hamilton City Council, the Waikato Institute of Technology and the New Zealand Fire Service and has travelled overseas with the All Blacks in a kaumātua role.) Hare Puke is a man committed to the promotion of the Māori people in all fields of endeavour. His community work, in diverse areas such as policing, electoral reform, health, education and tourism, has been widely recognised. Honours bestowed upon Hare include the 1990 Commemoration Medal from the Crown in recognition of services to New Zealand and a Special Civic Award for leadership from the Hamilton City Council in 1996.

Wharehuia Milroy

Wharehuia Milroy of Tūhoe was awarded the degree of Honorary Doctor of the University of Waikato on 16 April 2005. The award recognises his contribution to the University over a period of 23 years as an academic staff member in the Māori Department, and his dedication to the revitalisation and regeneration of te reo and tikanga Māori throughout the nation. Wharehuia Milroy played a key role in nurturing the growth of Māori teaching and research at the University of Waikato, using innovative techniques that are now followed widely. He was an advisor in the process of creating the School of Māori and Pacific Development, and also played an important part in the reconfiguration of the University crest and the motto "ko te tangata". His knowledge of Māori law and tikanga was of significant value in the development of Te Mātāhauariki Research Institute. Nationally he is held in high esteem with agencies such as the Māori Language Commission, Te Kohanga Reo Trust, the Treaty of Waitangi Tribunal and the Tertiary Education Commission regularly seeking his expert advice. Wharehuia was awarded the Queen's Service Order (QSO) in 2003 for his services to the community.

Margaret Mahy

Margaret Mahy will be awarded the degree of Honorary Doctor of the University of Waikato at a graduation ceremony on 22 April 2005 in recognition of her national and international profile as a writer of fiction for children and young adults. Margaret Mahy's career as a writer has spanned more than 30 years. She has published more than 120 titles and her work has been translated into 12 languages. Margaret spent 22 years as a librarian specialising in children's literature. She is well renowned internationally and has received numerous accolades for her work, including the prestigious British Library Association's Carnegie Medal (twice) and the New Zealand Library Association's Esther Glen Medal (five times). Other awards include the Goodman Fielder Wattie Award for Junior Fiction, the Young Observer Fiction Prize, the Italian Premier Grafico Award and the Dutch Silver Pencil Award. Margaret's work features regularly on the shortlist for the annual New Zealand Post Children's Book Awards, and she has been a winner on three occasions. However, the most telling prize of all is her audience. The rich language of Margaret's writing has made an enormous contribution to the creative and imaginative lives of children and young people around the globe.
