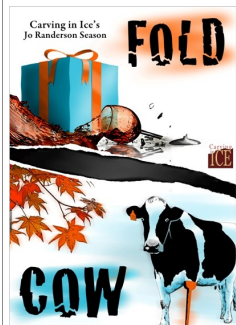

## **Beethoven! Revolution** **New Zealand String Quartet**

The **New Zealand String Quartet**, the country's foremost chamber ensemble, celebrates its 25th anniversary in 2012.

They have forged a major international career, earning the acclaim of critics and the delighted response of audiences. The quartet has particularly distinguished itself through imaginative programming and insightful interpretations of the string quartet repertoire.

The string quartets of Beethoven's 'middle' period, a period in which he expressed heroic and revolutionary sentiments, are substantial and profound works. The group includes the three Quartets of Opus 59, commissioned by **Count Razumovsky**, Russian Ambassador to Vienna. Completed in 1806 after a year of sketching and composing, these works are symphonic in scope.

Halida Dinova comes from Kazan in Tartarstan, Russia. After studying at Kazan State Conservatory she completed an Aspiranta degree at the Rimsky-Korsakov Conservatory in St Petersburg with renowned pianist Anatol Ugarski. Winning the Geza Anda competition led to a concert tour and scholarship from the European Mozart Foundation. She then moved to the United States, earning an Artist Diploma from the Cleveland Institute of Music. Prizewinner of several international competitions, Ms Dinova has performed in North America, Russia, Mexico, Canada, the United Kingdom, Italy, Bulgaria, Germany, France, Italy and Argentina.

Ms Dinova's recordings include a 2004 recording of Brahms' Second Piano Concerto with the St. Petersburg Academic Philharmonic Symphony Orchestra, and *Masterpieces for Children* by Bach.

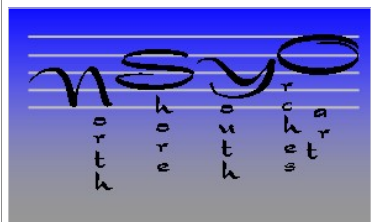

This exciting, high calibre contemporary dance show is supported by kiwi electronic music, original acoustic recordings; live waiata, and haka!

**KAHA**, is comprised of 8 short works choreographed by members of the company.

Artistic Director **Moss Patterson**, presents three NEW short works, 'HAKA' a contemporary work fusing traditional movement, 'Moko' a fast full cast piece, exploring the art of body tattoo, and 'Koru' inspired by the spiral design, as seen in Maori art.

'Piata', **Taane Mete's** work is a breathtaking female solo exploring the idea of an entity existing between two worlds, and inspired by the mythical Patupaiarehe.

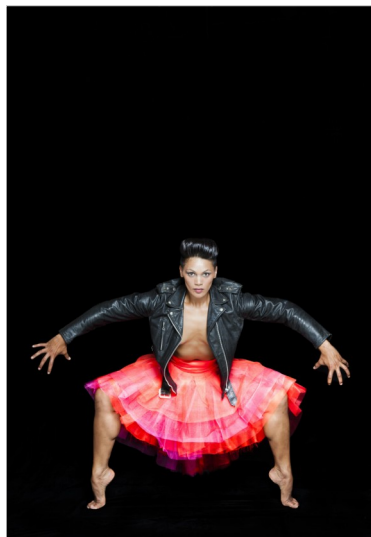

### **Remix: Works by Hemi Mcgregor**

Hemi Macgregor (Ngāti Kahungunu, Ngāi Tūhoe, Pākehā) has created a dynamic art practice that mixes issues of contemporary youth culture with Maori concepts of knowledge, time and identity. This solo exhibition spans nearly 15 years of work featuring painting, sculpture and mixed media.

Hemi has exhibited extensively throughout New Zealand and internationally including Taiawhio: Conversations with Contemporary Maori Artists at Te Papa Tongarewa, The IntraNation Project at The Banff Centre, Canada; Pasifika Styles at Cambridge Museum of Archaeology and Anthropology, United Kingdom; and Existence: Life according to Art at Waikato Museum, Hamilton.
