

## Protocols for the oral examination of a doctoral thesis examined within a Māori context

Mihi (convenor)

• Acknowledge candidate's whānau, visiting examiners, and candidate

Opportunity for brief response from whānau representative

Karakia (convenor or nominee)

• Open proceedings

Explanation of the examination process (convenor)

**Oral examination proceeds** 

Closing karakia (convenor or nominee)

**Convenor returns completed Oral Examination Report to PGSO** 

Celebration with kai, often in another room – arranged by Chief Supervisor

## Other points to note:

- The Convenor cannot be:
  - o From the same department as the candidate
  - On the candidate's supervisory panel
  - $\circ$   $\,$  Of close kinship or have any other identified conflict of interest  $\,$

## • Venue

• The oral examination is expected to be held in a formal venue such as the University meeting room. The University marae is not suitable for the oral examination.

## Whānau involvement

- Chief Supervisor, candidate and convenor must give permission for whānau to be in attendance.
- An information sheet will be provided prior to the oral examination, outlining the process and explaining the role of whānau.
