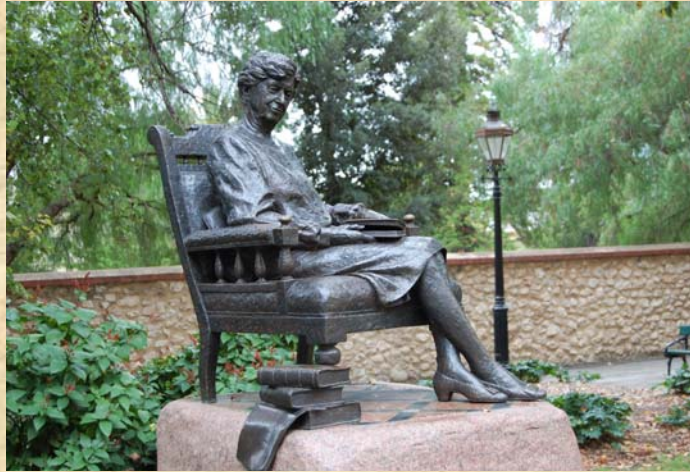

## CALL FOR PAPERS

### LAW & HISTORY CONFERENCE; ADELAIDE, 11-13 DECEMBER 2008; CALL FOR PAPERS

The 27th annual conference of the Australian and New Zealand Law and History Society will meet in Adelaide from Thursday 11 to Saturday 13 December 2008. Diane Kirkby (La Trobe University) and John McLaren (University of Victoria, BC) have kindly agreed to deliver the keynote addresses. A number of 'Bruce Kercher Postgraduate scholarships' are also be made available for the first time by the ANZLHS, in order to encourage participation by postgraduate students; most of the first day of the conference will be devoted to papers by postgraduates, providing special opportunities to interact and discuss their work with the keynote speakers and other senior scholars.

Proposals are now invited for individual (20 minute) papers or multi-speaker panels on any topic within the broad field of law and history. As at past conferences, there will be no restriction on the geographical or chronological areas covered, but a tight limit of 20 minutes - say 12-13 double-spaced A4 pages - is imposed on the delivery of papers, so as to leave 10 minutes after each paper for questions and discussion. Proposals should include a title, a one or two-paragraph abstract, and a brief CV (half-page), together with contact details (name, postal address, telephone numbers, email address). Electronic submissions are welcomed, and should be sent to [anzlhs@adelaide.edu.au](mailto:anzlhs@adelaide.edu.au) postal submissions may be sent to ANZLHS, School of History and Politics, University of Adelaide, SA 5005. The deadline for paper proposals is **30 June 2008**.
