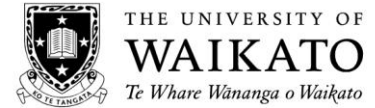


Cayne Dunnett Memorial Scholarship



REGULATIONS

BACKGROUND

This Scholarship was established in 2006 in memory of Cayne Dunnett, a Bank of New Zealand employee who joined the Bank of New Zealand in December 1994 after completing a BMS (1st Class Honours) at Waikato University. Cayne was an accomplished student (Dux of School, various prizes at School and Waikato University including: 1992 Coopers and Lybrand prize in Financial Accounting, 1994 Peat Marwick Prize in Taxation, 1994 Ernst and Young Memorial Scholarship, 1993 Beattie Rickman Prize in Taxation), and sportsman (rugby representative for Waikato and NZ Universities), and also had a strong record of community service and involvement while at school and university.

Cayne joined the Bank as a graduate trainee and quickly distinguished himself in the Financial Markets Division Bank in New Zealand over five years, before accepting a transfer to the National Australia Bank in London where he eventually held the position of Head of Structured Products. He was in the process of returning to a senior role in New Zealand (after five years in London) when he died of a heart attack.

He met his wife Delwyn at Waikato, where she was also a student and has a young daughter, Madison.

REGULATIONS

1. This Scholarship is open for application from students undertaking a Bachelor of Management Studies at Waikato University, and enrolling in their final year in 2010.
2. The recipient of this Scholarship will receive the chance to undertake up to two months of sponsored summer holiday work (and subsidised accommodation if required), in the Markets (Treasury) environment of the Bank of New Zealand in Wellington or Auckland. Subsequent to the summer holiday work, if the candidate is employed in a full-time role within BNZ markets, a one-off grant of \$10,000 will be made towards paying off that student's Loan.
3. This Scholarship will be awarded annually.
4. During the period of the scholarship the recipient will be employed on a fixed term agreement.
5. When awarding this Scholarship, the Selection Panel will take into account the applicant's academic merit, sporting and cultural achievements and contribution to the community.
6. One Scholarship will be awarded annually, unless due to the quality of applicants, the Selection Panel deems it suitable to award more than one.
7. The Cayne Dunnett Memorial Scholarship will be awarded on the recommendation of a Selection Committee which shall include Mrs Delwyn Dunnett, BNZ Head of Markets, and Dawn Lorimer (Course coordinator for Masters of Applied Finance at Victoria University and Cayne's Dean

when he was at Waikato) and / or a suitable Waikato University Academic.

8. Applicants should submit their credentials in writing, with supporting evidence of their academic, sporting, cultural and / or community contribution.
9. All applicants will be advised in writing by the University of Waikato Scholarships Office of the results of their application after the Selection Panel's decision.
10. The offer of a Scholarship must be accepted by the date indicated in the letter of offer. If any candidate declines a Scholarship, or does not take it up, the Scholarship may be offered to another person.
11. Any exception or variation to these arrangements must be approved by the Selection Panel.
12. With the consent of the Bank of New Zealand, the University may from time to time vary these regulations.
