## Newton International Fellowship Scheme

The Newton International Fellowship scheme, run by The British Academy, The Royal Academy of Engineering and the Royal Society, aims to attract the world's best postdoctoral researchers to the UK for two years.

The Fellowships cover the broad range of natural and social sciences, engineering and the humanities and are open to early-stage postdoctoral researchers who do not hold UK citizenship and are working outside the UK. Fifty Fellowships are available per round and successful candidates will receive an annual subsistence of £24,000, up to £8,000 for research expenses, and a one-off payment of up to £2,000 for relocation. Newton Fellows may be eligible for follow-on funding of up to £6,000 per year for ten years, to help develop lasting international networks with the UK.

The scholar will be required to enrol as a full-time student in an undergraduate degree for the full academic year for which the Scholarship is awarded (a minimum of 120 points, usually eight papers). The scholar will be enrolled at the University for the first time in 2009, and must commence study in the first semester of 2009. Scholars must be New Zealand citizens or permanent residents.

## German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD) Scholarships for New Zealand

*Closing dates vary*

*Level: Graduate / Postgraduate*

The DAAD (<http://www.daad.ac.nz>) is Germany's largest scholarship-awarding organisation and runs several programmes ranging from short-term exchanges for research or teaching purposes through to doctoral scholarships lasting several years. The scholarships offered by the DAAD are awarded to younger university graduates from all academic disciplines as well as from the fields of music and art. Support is also available for young academics and scientists, university teachers and groups completing study visits under the guidance of a university teacher. Applicants are generally expected to be New Zealand nationals; foreign nationals may be eligible if they are permanent residents of New Zealand. Temporary residents need to prove that they have been long-term residents in New Zealand and that they intend to remain in New Zealand for the foreseeable future.

Awards include the following:

- **Research Grants for Doctoral Candidates and Young Academics and Scientists**  
*Closing dates 30 September (for a period beginning in February the following year) and 31 March (for a period beginning in August of the same year)*  
Young academics and scientists can apply for a scholarship to carry out a research project or a course at a German higher education institution or non-university research institute.
- **Study Scholarships for Graduates of All Disciplines**  
*Closing date 31 August (for a period beginning in April the following year)*  
Graduates of all disciplines can apply for a scholarship to complete a postgraduate or Master's degree course at a German higher education institution and to gain a degree in Germany (Masters/Diploma).
- **Study Scholarships for Artists**  
*Closing date 1 September*  
Study scholarships aim to provide foreign applicants from the field of Fine Arts, Design, Film, Music and Architecture with an opportunity to complete a course of extension studies at a state institution of higher education in Germany, without gaining a formal degree or qualification.
- **One-Semester Scholarships for University Students Reading German Studies**  
*Closing date 31 August*  
Students reading German studies, German as a foreign language, or translation studies can apply for a scholarship to spend a semester studying at a state or state-recognised German higher education institution (to be started either 1 April or 1 October).
- **Re-invitation Programme for Former Scholarship Holders**

In co-operation with the DAAD, the University of Freiburg, Leipzig and Essen offer a "Hochschulwinterkurs" lasting six weeks. The programme is designed for undergraduate and graduate students with a sound knowledge of German and some background in German Studies who are interested in improving their language skills and understanding of contemporary affairs.
- **Study Visits / Study Seminars and Practicals in Germany**  
*Closing dates 15 November (for trips to commence from 1 March the following year), 15 February (for trips to commence from 1 June the same year), and 15 May (for trips to commence from 1 September the same year)*

## Canadian Studies Awards

*Closing dates vary*

The Canadian Studies Program funds research and teaching in Canadian studies. The term 'Canadian studies' is defined as research in the humanities or social sciences which aims at a better understanding of Canadian society and or culture. Purely scientific subjects and proposals that focus exclusively on technological or methodological issues are not eligible.

Awards include the following:

- **ICCS Graduate Students Scholarship**

***Closing date: 30 September***

The International Council for Canadian Studies (ICCS) offers up to ten grants worldwide to masters and doctoral candidates to undertake thesis-related research on Canada at a Canadian university for 4-6 weeks.

- **Canadian Studies Internships**

Teaching or research internships (assistantships) of 1-3 months duration at a Canadian or foreign university with a Canadian Studies Program. Applicants must have completed a doctoral degree on a topic primarily related to Canada, and not be employed in a full-time university teaching position.

- **International Research Linkages (IRL)**

This programme aims to promote and facilitate international collaborative research between research teams from Canada and (one or more) countries where Canadian Studies are represented.

- **The Canada-Asia-Pacific Award in Canadian Studies (CAPA)**

Aimed at promoting the understanding of bilateral and multilateral relations between Canada and the Asia-Pacific, this award assists scholars in higher education institutions or research and policy planning institutes in the Asia-Pacific region to undertake short-term research, including collaborative research.

- **ACSANZ Postgraduate Travel Award**

***Closing date; 30 September***

Up to five grants are awarded each year to postgraduate students for a short research trip to Canada. Research must be related to the student's thesis topic and in Canadian Studies.

- **ICCS Canadian Studies Postdoctoral Fellowship**

***Closing date: 30 September***

This programme enables Canadian and foreign academics who have completed a doctoral thesis on a topic primarily related to Canada to visit a Canadian or foreign university with a Canadian Studies program for a teaching or research fellowship. Fellowships are for a minimum of one month and a maximum of three months. Applicants must not be employed in a full-time university teaching position and must agree not to accept honoraria or salary during their fellowships. The grant will be C\$2,500 per month plus the cost a return airline ticket.

- **ICCS Best Doctoral Thesis in Canadian Studies**

***Closing date: 30 September***

This ICCS Award is designed to recognize and promote each year an outstanding PhD thesis on a Canadian topic.
