Master of Laws (LLM) Scholarship

Closing date: Open until filled

Level: Graduate

Law, Behaviour, and Energy Efficiency

A Master of Laws (LLM) scholarship is available for an able student to carry out research on the legal dimension of energy efficiency. Energy efficiency is one of the most effective means of reducing greenhouse gas emissions and improving the delivery of useful energy services to people. The design of effective laws and regulations for energy efficiency requires a clear understanding of the human behaviour in using energy and responding to laws, regulations and policy instruments generally. The research is part of the Energy Cultures programme funded by the Ministry of Science and Innovation: http://www.csafe.org.nz/research/Energy%20Cultures/Energy_Cultures_home.shtml.

Special preference will be given to a student who has an aptitude for working as member of a multidisciplinary team, and for engaging with ideas about the interaction of law and human behaviour from disciplines such as physical science, psychology, economics, regulatory studies, and socio-legal studies.

The successful candidate will have an excellent Bachelor of Laws (LLB) or equivalent. He or she will research full-time at the University of Waikato, with some visits to the University of Otago.

The scholarship provides a stipend of \$16,000 plus up to \$5,000 towards the cost of enrolment fees. In addition, some funding will be provided for research costs. The scholarship can be taken-up between now and 1 February 2012.

Political Science and Public Policy Programmes Graduate Scholarships

Closing date 8 July 2011

Level: Graduate / Postgraduate

These Scholarships are open to application from postgraduate diploma or honours students who are first enrolling in these degrees in either A or B semester 2011, and who are pursuing at least two level-five papers in the programme. Applicants must have done their undergraduate major in either Political Science or Public Policy, gaining a minimum of an A- average for the final grade of the level-three papers of their undergraduate major. Awards have a value of up to \$2,200.

It can include a Hui, publication of a report or book and can focus on specific elements aimed at particular iwi/age or gender groups and/or at a particular health area (e.g. oral health, nutrition, cultural safety guidelines for a specific health provider centre, customary healing practices of a specified hapu or iwi).

Prime Minister's Science Prizes

- MacDiarmid Emerging Scientist Prize: Awarded to an outstanding emerging scientist undertaking research for a PhD or within five years of the date of the award of their PhD, and is valued at \$200,000.
- Science Media Communication Prize; Awarded to a practising scientist who is an effective communicator. The prize provides them with an opportunity to further develop their knowledge and capability in science media communication, and is valued at \$100,000.

Fellows must retain their New Zealand doctoral registration during the tenure of their award. Funding shall normally not exceed \$5,000.

Eligibility criteria to take special note of include the following. Funding is awarded for use in the academic year **following** the application. Applicants must have been **enrolled in their doctoral study for at least one year** at the time of application.

Rhodes Scholarship (UNZ)

These **highly competitive** Scholarships are awarded to students wishing to study at Oxford University in September/October 2012. These Scholarships are open to New Zealand citizens who will be over nineteen but **under twenty-five as at 1 October in the year for which they are elected**, and who will soon or have already graduated with a degree from a New Zealand university.

The Rhodes Trust will meet the cost of a Scholar's air travel, economy class, to and from the United Kingdom at the beginning and end of the Scholarship. A Rhodes Scholar is expected to receive a stipend of £12,200 sterling as a personal allowance in Oxford, with fees being paid directly by the Trust to the College and University.

Proven intellectual and academic ability of a high standard is the first quality required of applicants, but they will also be required to show integrity of character, interest in and respect for their fellow beings, the ability to lead and the energy to use their talents to the full.

Applicants must also show academic excellence, leadership potential and the ability to be a cultural ambassador for New Zealand. To be eligible, you must:

- Have completed the equivalent of four years of full time tertiary study and obtained a bachelor's degree, but not hold a doctoral degree at the time you take up your award
- **Have a minimum of three years' work experience in the proposed field of study**
- Have a realistic vision of how you will aid in the development of New Zealand's knowledge economy. Implicit in this is an awareness that you would be required to return to New Zealand on completion of your degree
- Be a New Zealand citizen (who is not a permanent resident or citizen of the US).

Preference for Fulbright awards is given to candidates who have not had extensive recent experience in the US

Fulbright-EQC Graduate Award in Natural Disaster Research

The Fulbright-EQC Graduate Award in Natural Disaster Research is for a promising graduate student to undertake postgraduate study or research at a US university in the area of natural disaster research. The award is granted for advanced academic study in the US. Applicants must also show academic excellence, leadership potential and the ability to be a cultural ambassador for New Zealand.

To be eligible, you must:

- Have completed the equivalent of four years of full time tertiary study and obtained a bachelor's degree, but not hold a doctoral degree at the time you take up your award
- Be accepted into an American university approved by EQC and Fulbright New Zealand for studies related to natural disaster research. Acceptance does not need to be confirmed at the time of application. For the purposes of this award 'natural disaster research' is defined as research into the risks posed by natural disasters, the hazards they present, their impact, society's vulnerability, mitigation and management measures
- Have a maximum of five years' experience working in the field
- Be a New Zealand citizen (who is not a permanent resident or citizen of the US).

The Livestock Emissions & Abatement Research Network (LEARN) is an international research network focused upon improving the understanding of greenhouse gas emissions from livestock agriculture. The Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry offers up to nine New Zealand LEARN Fellowships per annum for **scientists or technicians from developing countries** to work in New Zealand in the area of Livestock Emissions Research.

The objectives of the network are to improve the quantification of non-CO₂ greenhouse gas emissions from animal agriculture at all scales, and to facilitate the development of cost effective and practical greenhouse gas mitigation solutions.

There are two separate categories available. These are **LEARN Work Trainee Awards** (tenure up to six months) and **LEARN Postdoctoral Fellowships** (tenure up to twelve months).
