### **Communication and Positive Ageing PhD Scholarship**

*Closing date: 15 September 2010*

*Level: Graduate / Postgraduate*

The Positive Ageing Postgraduate Scholarship aims to assist and encourage a student to pursue a Master / PhD at the University of Waikato in the area of communication and positive ageing. The student's research will be supported by a funded research project entitled 'Engaging Senior Stakeholders: Positive Ageing at the Elder-Organisation Interface'. The student is required to conduct research that will contribute to this project. The specifics will be negotiated, and may include for example, research focused on elders and mainstream organisations and/or Māori organisations working with kaumātua.

In the case of the student working with Māori organisations and kaumātua, cultural-academic supervision will be provided alongside supervision by research-team members from the Department of Management Communication. The Scholarship provides a stipend of \$10,000 plus up to \$5,000 towards the cost of enrolment fees annually for two years (2011 & 2012). In addition, some funding will be provided for travel to present research at national conferences.

The particular area of relevance to the Gas Industry has been identified as "The Effects of Supply Chain Dynamics on Consumer Perception of Natural Gas as a Valid Option for New Zealand". This may be the thesis title for the Masters, or a similar thesis title would be considered.

Specific topics that may be part of the thesis study are:

- Supply chain logistics
- The influence of public policy interactions and regulatory process
- Climate change issues from a carbon footprint perspective
- Technology innovation and commercial arrangements in a competitive market.

### **Canadian Studies Awards**

The Canadian Studies Program funds research and teaching in Canadian studies. The term 'Canadian studies' is defined as research in the humanities or social sciences which aims at a better understanding of Canadian society and or culture. Purely scientific subjects and proposals that focus exclusively on technological or methodological issues are not eligible.

Awards include the following:

- **ICCS Graduate Students Scholarship**  
**Closing date: 30 September**  
The International Council for Canadian Studies (ICCS) offers up to ten grants worldwide to masters and doctoral candidates to undertake thesis-related research on Canada at a Canadian university for 4-6 weeks.
- **Canadian Studies Internships**  
Teaching or research internships (assistantships) of 1-3 months duration at a Canadian or foreign university with a Canadian Studies Program. Applicants must have completed a doctoral degree on a topic primarily related to Canada, and not be employed in a full-time university teaching position.
- **International Research Linkages (IRL)**  
This programme aims to promote and facilitate international collaborative research between research teams from Canada and (one or more) countries where Canadian Studies are represented.
- **The Canada-Asia-Pacific Award in Canadian Studies (CAPA)**  
Aimed at promoting the understanding of bilateral and multilateral relations between Canada and the Asia-Pacific, this award assists scholars in higher education institutions or research and policy planning institutes in the Asia-Pacific region to undertake short-term research, including collaborative research.
- **ACSANZ Postgraduate Travel Award**  
**Closing date: 30 September**  
Up to five grants are awarded each year to postgraduate students for a short research trip to Canada. Research must be related to the student's thesis topic and in Canadian Studies.
- **ICCS Canadian Studies Postdoctoral Fellowship**

## **German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD) Scholarships for New Zealand**

*Closing dates vary*

*Level: Graduate / Postgraduate*

The German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD) is a joint organisation of the German institutions of higher education. The purpose of the DAAD is to promote relations between these German institutions and higher education institutions abroad, primarily through the exchange of students, academics and scientists. The scholarships offered by the DAAD are awarded to advanced students, young higher education graduates, excellent scientists and academics from all fields of science and humanities as well as from fields of music and art.

Applicants are generally expected to be New Zealand nationals; foreign nationals may be eligible if they are permanent residents of New Zealand. Temporary residents need to prove that they have been long-term residents in New Zealand and that they intend to remain in New Zealand for the foreseeable future. Awards include the following:

### **One-Semester Scholarships for University Students Reading German Studies**

*Closing date: 31 August*

These one-semester scholarships provide foreign students reading German studies, German as a foreign language, or translation studies with an opportunity to spend a semester studying at a state (public) or state-recognised German higher education institution. One-semester scholarships are awarded for the summer (1 April) or the winter semester (1 October) and cannot be extended. Applicants should be excellently-qualified students having successfully completed their second or third academic year, when they begin the scholarship-supported semester, and will have a convincing presentation of the academic and personal motives for the planned study semester in Germany.

### **Research Grants for Doctoral Candidates, Young Academics and Scientists**

*Closing dates: 1 September for long-term visits, 30 September and 31 March for short-term visits up to six months*

Research grants provide young foreign academics and scientists with an opportunity to carry out a research project or a course of continuing education at a German university or non-university research institute as follows:

- Research projects at a German university for a doctorate in the home country.
- Research projects or continuing education without aiming for a formal degree/qualification.

Duration will be one to 12 months; scholarships may be extended up to 24 months. Applicants will be excellently-qualified graduates holding a Master's degree or its equivalent and will have a convincing and well-planned research or continuing education and training project.

### **Study Scholarships for Graduates of All Disciplines**

*Closing date:: 1 September*

Ten to twenty-four-month study scholarships are awarded to provide foreign graduates of all disciplines with opportunities to complete a postgraduate or Master's degree course at a German higher education institution and to gain a degree in Germany (Master's/Diplom). Applicants will be excellently-qualified graduates holding a first degree (Bachelor's), and will have a convincing presentation of the applicant's academic and personal reasons for the planned study project in Germany

### **Study Scholarships for Artists**

*Closing date:: 1 September*

These study scholarships aim to provide foreign applicants from the field of Fine Art, Design, Film, Music and Architecture as well as Drama, Direction, Dance and Choreography with an opportunity to complete a course of extension studies, without gaining a formal degree or qualification, at a German state (public) or state-recognised higher education institution. The scholarships last one academic year, and may be extended. Applicants must have an appropriate degree.

### **Research Stays for University Academics and Scientists**

*Closing dates: 30 September for stays to run from February of the following year, 31 March for stays to run from August of the same year*

These one- to three-month grants aim to provide foreign academics and scientists working in higher education or at research institutes with an opportunity to carry out a research project at a higher education institution or non-university research institute in Germany. Applicants will have a well-planned research or work project to be completed during the stay in Germany, and proof of a workplace being provided at the host institute.

### **Re-invitation Programme for Former Scholarship Holders**

*Closing dates: 30 September for stays to run from February of the following year, 31 March for stays to run from August of the same year*

Former one-year scholarship holders can apply for re-invitation to Germany (for one to three months) to complete a research or work project at a state (public) or state-recognised higher education institution or non-university research institute. Applicants will have a well-planned research or work project to be completed during the stay in Germany, proof of a workplace being provided at the host institute, and support for a re-invitation can only be awarded once in any three-year period.

### **Study Visits / Study Seminars and Practicals in Germany by Foreign Students**

*Closing dates: 15 November each year for trips starting from 1 March, 15 February each year for trips starting from 1 June, and 15 May each year for trips starting from 1 September*

The seven to twelve-day programme aims to provide students with subject-related knowledge by arranging appropriate visits, tours and information meetings (Study Visits) or by organising subject-related seminars and practical courses. It also aims to give students a greater understanding of and insight (regional and area studies) into economic, political and cultural life in Germany. Applicants will be groups of ten to fifteen students who are fully matriculated in their third semester (2nd year) or higher in a relevant degree

The Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry offers up to nine New Zealand LEARN Fellowships per annum for **scientists or technicians from developing countries** to work in New Zealand in the area of Livestock Emissions Research.

The objectives of the network are to improve the quantification of non-CO<sub>2</sub> greenhouse gas emissions from animal agriculture at all scales, and to facilitate the development of cost effective and practical greenhouse gas mitigation solutions.

There are two separate categories available. These are **LEARN Work Trainee Awards** (tenure up to six months) and **LEARN Postdoctoral Fellowships** (tenure up to twelve months).
