Facilitating change through coaching and mentoring

Building effective, respectfully challenging and supportive professional mentoring relationships. Understanding effective change management practices. Working with diverse groups of learners, both adult and student to identify goals and create plans of action. Embracing the concept of ako, having humility in interactions with others and acknowledging the reciprocal nature of learning. Using responsive methodology, individual and collective learning for improvement. Uncovering and challenging educational beliefs that may impact on practice.

Assessment Capability

Critiquing review processes in strategic planning, faculty, syndicate and pedagogical areas. Use of collaborative self-review processes to identify and evaluate current capabilities against desired outcomes. Linking evidence from a range of areas to identify specific foci for the PLD supported by a coherent theory for improvement. Using teaching as inquiry as the foundation for evaluating current practice and designing future effective practices. Identifying relevant data and using targeted observations to unveil student and teacher knowledge.

Summary of examples of practice

Learning with Digital Technologies
<i>My work in an urban secondary school had the following foci</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none">to support the implementation of a BYOD programmesto support the school to develop a strategic plan for the integration of digital technologiesto support schools in the design of a vision statement for the place of digital technologies in the schoolto support teachers to develop confidence and capabilities for using digital technologiesto provide advice and guidance to the lead team in designing professional development for staff.

My facilitation strategies included

- meeting with lead teachers to discuss contract and determine the desired outcomes
- facilitating staff meetings using the *ELPF (ELearning Planning Framework)*
- supporting teachers to analyse data from the ELPF and create a Development Plan
- encouraging an environment of transparency within the staff and leadership
- providing a range of timely, relevant support material, based on research, tailored to meet identified staff needs, across all learning areas
- maintaining regular contact with the school, lead teachers in both face to face and online ways
- co-constructing the PLD to suit the school needs alongside the lead teachers/leaders
- enlisting the support of the principal to clarify their role and the lead teacher roles and responsibilities
- scheduling regular reviews of progress and adjusting the support when necessary
- facilitating discussions and asking challenging questions of leaders and teachers
- supporting leaders to design their own way forward with PLD, rather than imposing a programme on them.

As a result of our work together

- a comprehensive vision statement document was created and shared with the whole staff and the BOT and community. The vision statement is being used as the driver of decisions.
- the teachers have gained confidence in using digital technologies
- there is a greater amount of sharing learning between teachers and across learning areas
- each learning area has a plan based on a common framework which outlines how they will implement a staged rollout of the implementation of digital technologies for each year level
- staff evaluate digital tools more critically rather than use tools for 'fun' the infrastructure is continually being re-evaluated as part of the annual plan
