# 17.54 ACADEMIC AUDIT – PROPOSAL FOR CYCLE 6

  - c. Amendments to the regulations for the Bachelor of Education and the Bachelor of Teaching as a result of the Curriculum Design Framework, as set out in document 17/257b.
  - d. Adding existing majors to the Bachelor of Business and Bachelor of Business (Honours), as set out in document 17/257c.
  - e. Adding existing majors to the BMS(Hons), as set out in document 17/257d.
  - f. Amendments to align the Bachelor of Science Electronics major with the new degree structure, as set out in document 17/257e.
  - g. Adding the existing subject 'Environmental Sciences' to the MSc, MSc(Tech), as set out in document 17/257f.
  - h. Amendments to the regulations for the MSc and MSc(Research), as set out in document 17/257g.
  - i. Amendments to the MSc(Tech) regulations, as set out in document 17/257h.

## Noted in discussion

Certificate in STEM (17/156a)

- 1. That Section 12 of the proposal should list:
  - a. the available subjects, papers and subject codes
  - b. the paper names and codes of the relevant pedagogy papers.

Master of Engineering Practice (17/156c)

- 2. That Section A1 of the proposal should name the four subjects available in the Master of Engineering Practice: electronic engineering, materials and process engineering, mechanical engineering and engineering practice.
- 3. That in Section 12 the terms 'programme' and 'subject' had not been used consistently and should be revised
- 4. That it was suggested that the letter of support from the Institution of Professional Engineers New Zealand (IPENZ) be included with the proposal. It was raised that IPENZ would not normally provide any support for a masters degree as these were not accredited by IPENZ. The Institution also sought to remain neutral and not to be seen to support any one institution over another. It was resolved not to include the letter of support from IPENZ.

Conjoint Degrees (17/33)

- 5. That only the six most common combinations of conjoint degrees would be set up for students to enrol in, although other combinations would be considered on a case-by-case basis. The regulations now made explicit that students would need to meet the pre-requisites required for both degrees in a conjoint.
- 6. That it was raised that the establishment of the Institute of Security and Crime Science had precipitated a growing interest in a conjoint degree in Law and Computer Science and that it may be useful to include this conjoint in the combinations being set up.

Bachelor of Education and the Bachelor of Teaching (17/257b)

- That TEACH310 Literacy and Mathematics 3, for the Primary, Kakano Rua and Secondary teaching streams had been proposed as a shared Level 300 paper. The Education Council had recommended that separate literacy and numeracy papers be developed.
- 8. That the requested papers would be developed and, once approved by Faculty of Education staff, would be submitted to the Chair of the Education Committee and Chair of the Academic Board for executive approval.

Master of Science and Master of Science (Research) (17/257g)

That the following amendment be made to Section 2, paragraph 1, sentence 4: Associated with this is the increased demand for <u>so-called "conversion"</u> qualifications, ...

The following points were raised in relation to Open Day that:

- 1. Open Day would more vibrant on a teaching day when staff and students were in attendance and allowed prospective students to more fully experience the University.
- 2. The University could run half lectures and introduce some interesting sessions and interactive digital material. Current students could be included in running demonstrations.
- 3. Open Day had been run on a Saturday in the past and had attracted large crowds of students, parents and other interested members of the public.
- 4. The University had a responsibility to fee-paying students; the service provided by the University was teaching and research, which should not be compromised. The introduction of another non-teaching day in A Semester would equate to the loss of up to 10% of teaching days.
- 5. In some other countries semesters ran for a specified number of days and were not limited to Monday to Friday, an extra non-teaching day could be accommodated via a similar process.
