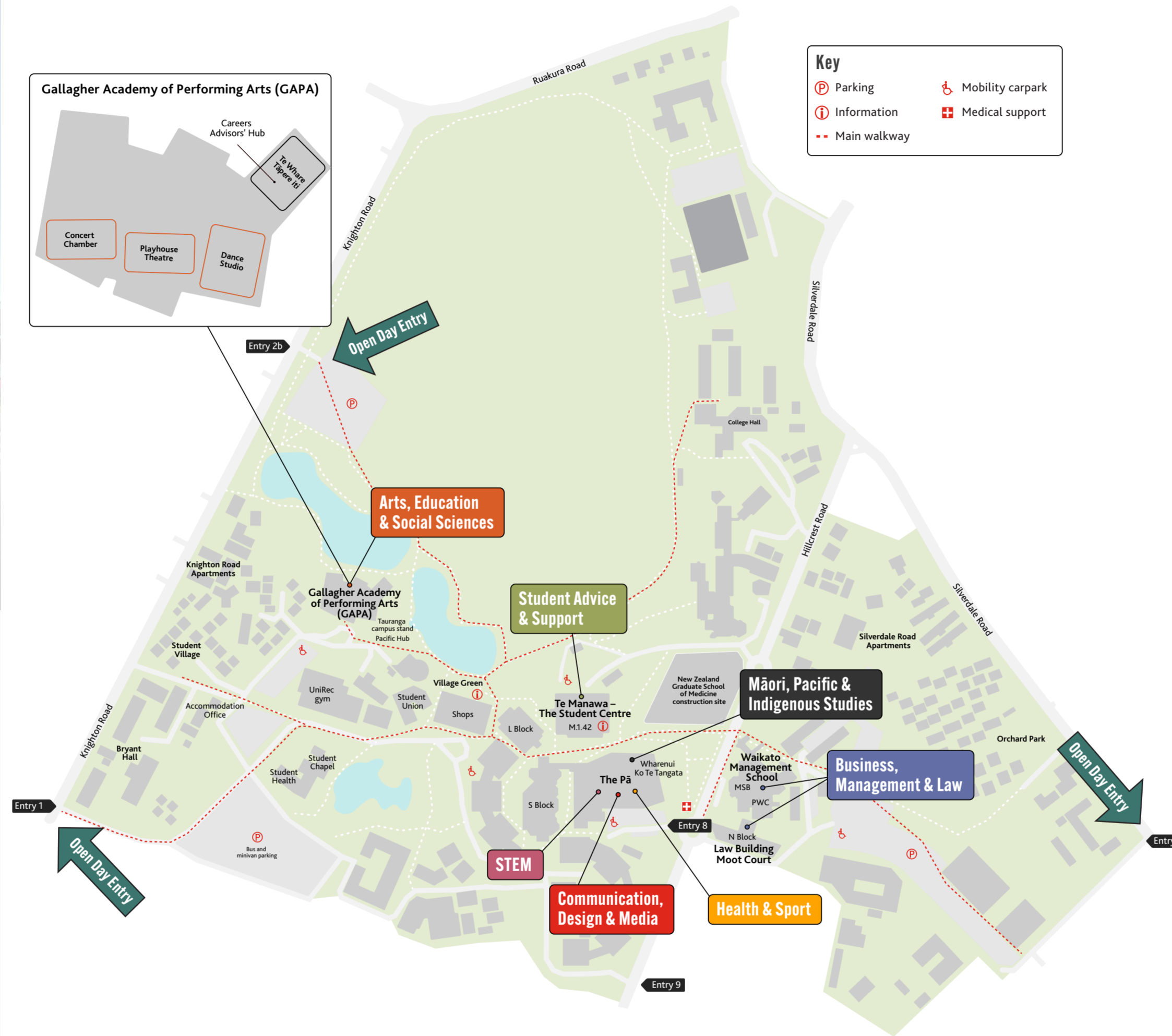
Tours
