

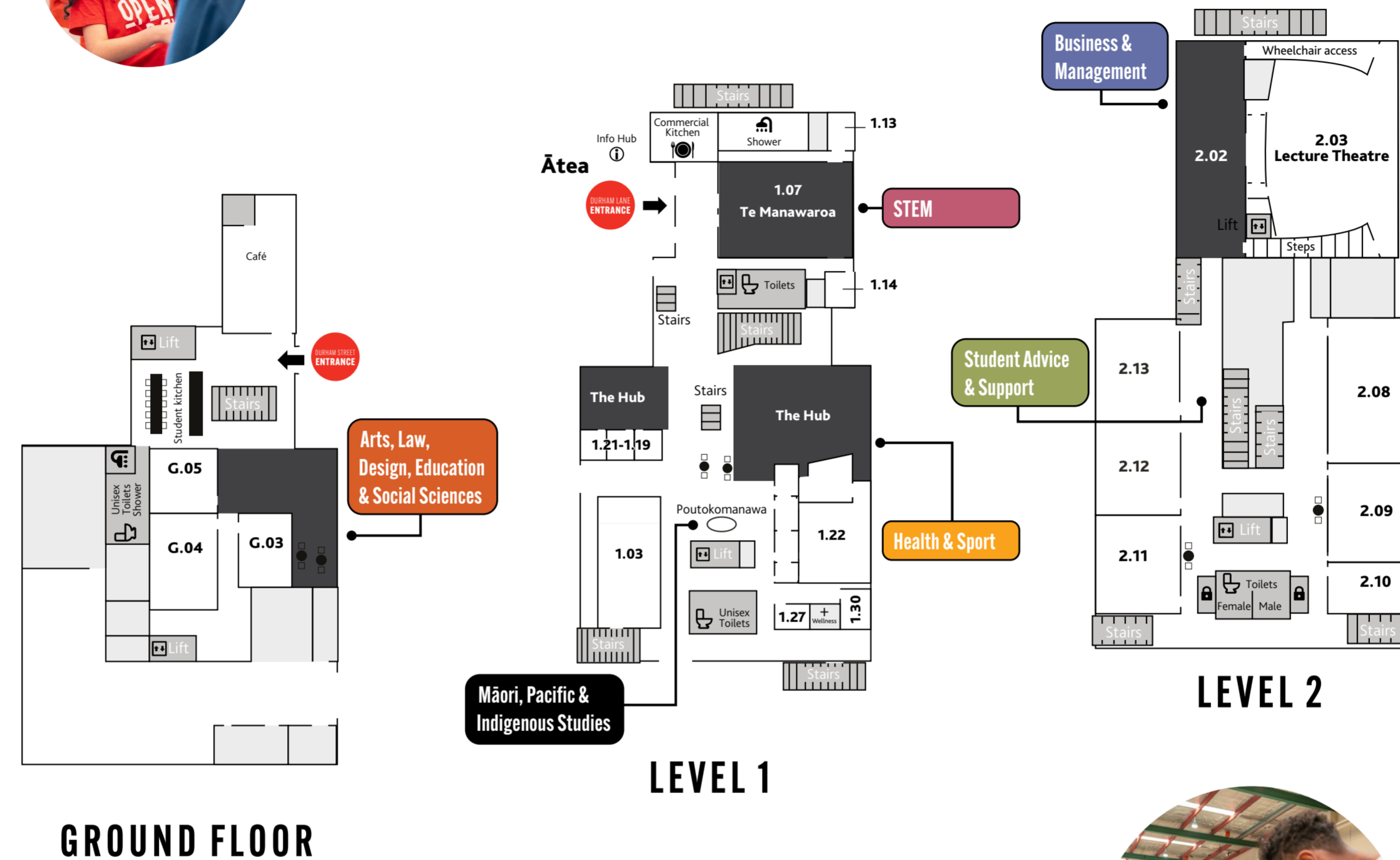


Tauranga Campus Map
