He whakarāpopotonga tauira mahi

My work as a facilitator for Assessment PLD in a dual medium rumaki unit included ensuring data was reliable, relevant and analysed, and using data to inform teaching and learning to improve and accelerate student learning. The impact of my work in this context was evident in:

- · how the kaiako was using inquiry to inform high quality teaching and learning programmes
- improved content knowledge and pedagogical practice of kaiako for pāngarau and Te Reo Matatini
- improved student outcomes and achievement of ākonga.

As a facilitator for Assessment PLD across seven kura, the main focus areas included developing, implementing and reviewing coherent systems, polices and practices of assessment of learning and assessment for learning. The impact of my work in this context was evident in:
