


## Missing Publications

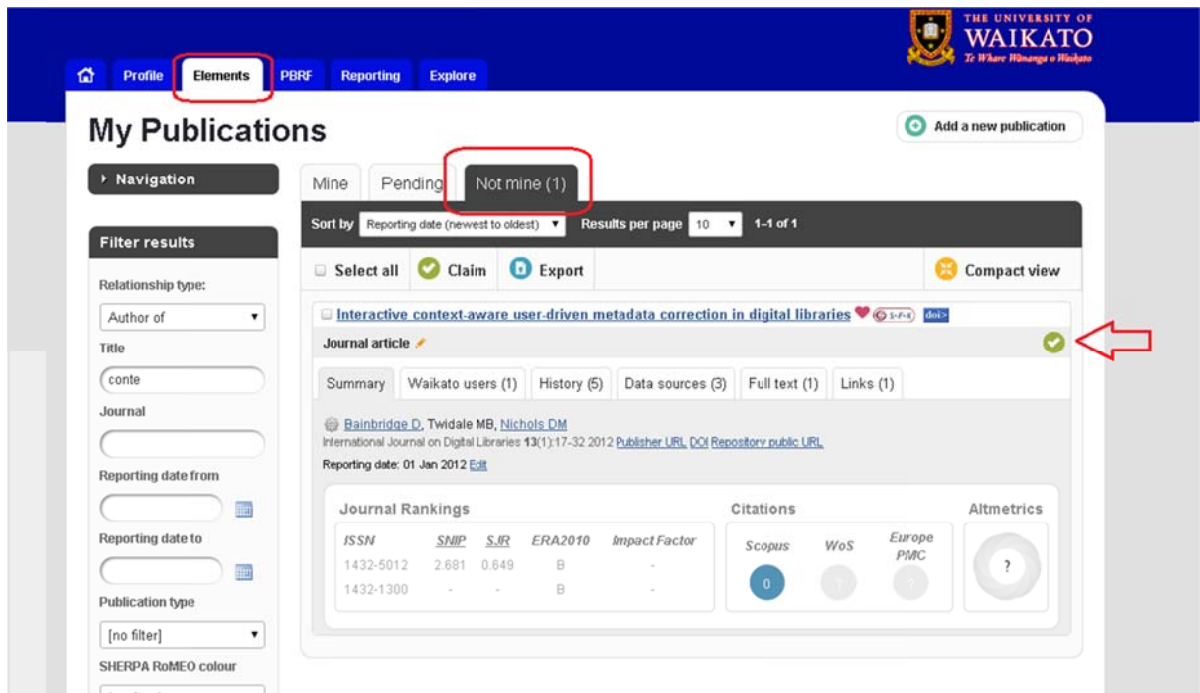
### Why can't I find my research output (publication) in IRIS?

- 1) Make sure that your search filter is **Reset**. The search feature remembers your last search and sometimes it confuses people.
